Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- › be at least 18 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › reside in New Zealand
- › have successfully completed a Level 4 qualification or NCEA Level 2

Applicants who do not meet these entry requirements may be granted special admission.

In this case, applicants must:

- › provide proof of relevant educational/work /life experience in adult education
- › meet the competencies required in literacy and numeracy
- › provide evidence of their ability to successfully pursue and complete the programme

All applicants must also:

- › complete an application package and participate in an interview and selection process to demonstrate suitability to the programme
- › have access to at least six adult learners throughout the duration of the programme

Practice-based learning (practicum) is a compulsory component of this programme.

- › In accordance with the Vulnerable Children's Act 2014, all applicants will need to participate in safety checks including police vetting as part of the pre-enrolment process

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 60 credits delivered over 20 weeks. Throughout the programme you'll be required to attend:

- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (3-5 hours per week)
- › 4 x noho marae (25 hours per noho)
- › 3 x 1-day wānanga (12 hours per wānanga)

You'll also need to complete learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately:

- › 22 hours per week

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need to have access to an internet-connected device for this programme.
