Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- › be at least 16 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › reside in New Zealand
- › attend an interview and selection process to demonstrate suitability to the programme

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits delivered over 38 weeks. Depending on your location you might be able to choose from one of the following study options:

Option 1: (Face to face delivery):

- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (10 hours per week)
- › 9 x 1-day wānanga (10 hours per wānanga)

You'll also need to complete learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately:

- › 21 hours per week

Option 2 (Noho delivery)

- › 10 x noho marae (25 hours per noho)
- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (5 hours per week)
- › 2 x 1-day wānanga (10 hours per wānanga)

You'll also need to complete learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately:

- › 21 hours per week

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need to have access to an internet-connected device for this programme.
