Entry Criteria


To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 60 credits of learning over 20 weeks. You will be required to attend 108 hours (an average of 6 hours per week) that may be made up of:

- noho (extended workshop) usually Friday to Sunday
- > 1-day wānanga (workshop)
- > kura whakaako (in-class)

You'll also need to participate in learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately:

> 27 hours per week (on average)

Dates of your delivery schedule will be confirmed at enrolment. Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You will need to have access to an internetconnected device for this programme.
