- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › reside in New Zealand
- › be aware of the entry requirements into the NZ Police

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits, delivered over 38 weeks.

In Semester A you'll be required to attend:

- › 4 x 6 hour classes per week

Activity-directed learning (approximately 10 hours per week) will also need to be completed outside of class time.

In Semester B you'll be required to attend:

- › 2 x 4 hour classes per week
- › 2 x noho (25 hours each)

Activity-directed learning (approximately 23 hours per week) will also need to be completed outside of class time.

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need to have access to an internet-connected device for this programme.
